Some information on our offerings

Do's:

- You can drink the water from the taps. It is clean fresh, pure mountain water.
- Feel free to make use of the boules set, cricket bats & Frisbees in the store room.
- Swimming in our extensive dam in fresh mountain water is good for the soul or take a paddle on the canoe & the boat.
- Go for self-guided walks. We have 2 routes, please follow the colour markings on the rocks and stick to the roads/paths. The map of the routes is in this file.
- Wood for braai-ing and the bon fire is available as part of the venue.
- You are welcome to have a long hot shower if you like. We are blessed with a good supply of mountain water.
- Please let us know if something breaks (glasses, mugs, appliances, etc.) so that we can replace them. Glasses and mugs will be charged at R40 each.
- **It is very important to keep all doors latched at all times as we have the occasional strong winds.**
- **Check in is at 15:00 and check out is at 10:00** (unless specified otherwise when booking)
- If you would like us to clean up after your stay, please stack the dishes, cutlery and glasses neatly in the kitchen and we will gladly wash them at an additional fee of R300.
- In the summer heat, snakes do enjoy slithering about especially in long grass. Just keep a look out for them.
- Place glass bottles in the glass labelled bin (on the right of the lapa when facing the dam) and other refuse in the non-glass bin (on the left of the lapa when facing the dam).
- Please close all the doors and windows before you depart.

Don'ts

- No driving or parking in front of the cabins and braai area.

- No self-drives permitted. You are however most welcome to go for self-guided walks/cycles.
- No pets allowed.
- **No bon fire to be lit if the wind is blowing strongly. Douse fire before going to bed.**
- **No smoking indoors. Please throw all cigarette butts into dustbins.**

Light switches

- For inside the lapa, as well as in front of cabin 1 and 2, the switch is on the left of the inside braai at the electrical box. The two round knobs.
- For the big light at the outside braai area: Plug in black plug with black cable which is situated next to the lapa basin.
- For all cabins: Lights are situated inside the cabin on the left or right side of the door.
- For the big toilet, storeroom & path to the kitchen: Turn on inside the storeroom above the sink at the electrical box on the right hand side when entering the storeroom.
- For the kitchen, showers and top toilet: the switches are in the passage between the kitchen and shower doors.

Trails from the lapa

White Route

This is a circular walk/cycle route of roughly 1.5kms from the lapa around the dam and back to the lapa. Start to the left of the lapa when facing the dam and **follow the white arrows on the rocks.**

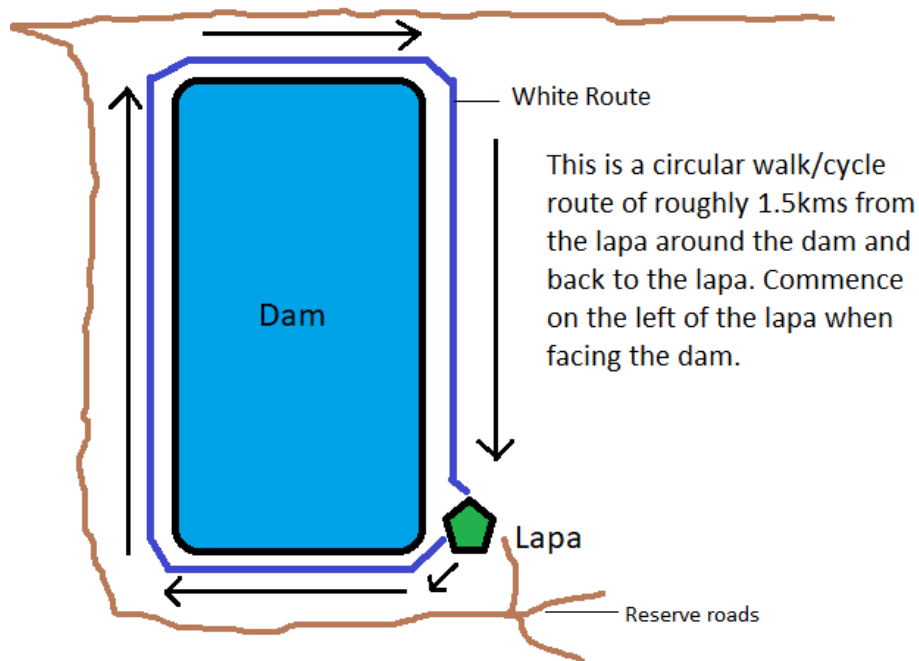
Red Route

This is a circular walk/cycle route of roughly 2.7kms from the lapa up to the buddah tree (1.7kms), then passing Bontebok Ridge Lookout point on your way back to the lapa (1km).

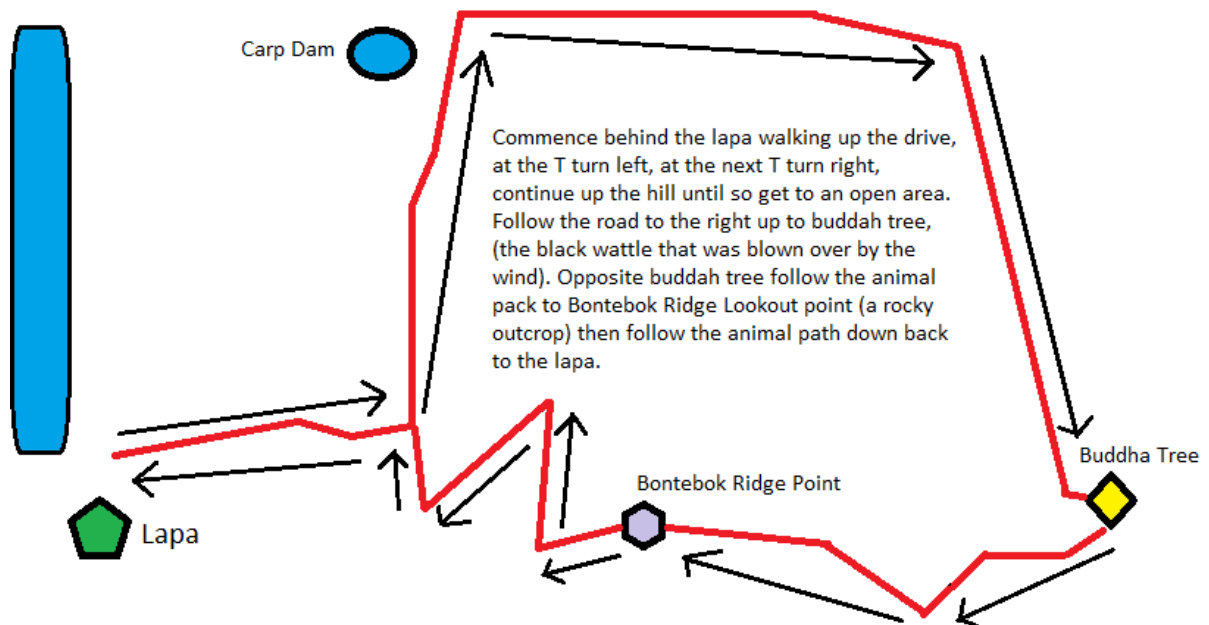
Start from behind the lapa walking up the road, at the T turn left, at the next T turn right, and continue up the hill until you get to an open area/field. Follow the road to the right (south) up to buddah tree (the black wattle that was blown over by the wind). Opposite buddah tree follow the animal path (west) to Bontebok Ridge Lookout point (a rocky outcrop), then follow the animal path down back to the lapa.

Follow the red arrows on the rocks.

Things for kids to do while spending time on our farm:

- Time how long it takes for a spider to spin its web, your heart beat, how long the animals spend at the dam, how long for any insect to move 10 meters, how long it takes the sun to rise and to set.
- Look at three trees and describe why they are different from each other.
- Stay up at night to look for shooting stars and satellites.
- Find three green things, four smooth things and five hard things.
- Draw something that you see through a magnifying glass or binoculars.
- Close your eyes and talk about how many smells and sounds you can identify.
- Make a collage with laves, bark, sand, flowers, plants and seeds (if you can glue them to a paper or cardboard base)
- Start a notebook and record what time the sun rises and sets daily.
